There are more than 100 billion feet of underground utilities in the United States, according to data compiled by CGA from various industry groups.



**DID YOU
KNOW?**



April is National Safe Digging Month. Careless digging poses a threat to people, pipelines and other underground facilities. To help ensure your safety, you are required to call 811—a toll-free, one-call notification center—48 to 72 hours before beginning any excavation or digging projects. By calling 811, you can verify the location of any underground facilities in and around your excavation site, such as hazardous liquid and natural

gas pipelines, telecommunications systems, electrical utilities, sewer pipelines and water pipelines. The required call even applies to small projects like planting trees and shrubs and installing mailboxes, fence posts, and swing sets. There is no cost to you, so **Call 811 Before You Dig.**

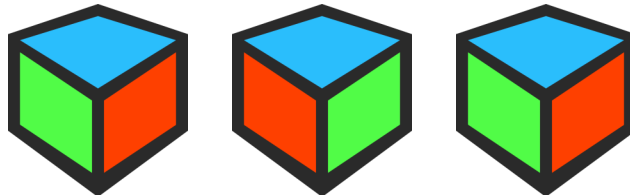

Helpful Spring Tips!

TO CONSERVE MATERIALS, RECYCLE:

Recycle aluminum cans, glass bottles, plastic, cardboard and newspapers. Using recycled materials in manufacturing consumes less energy than using virgin materials.

The City operates three recycling trailers located at 1405 N. Bridge in the parking lot of the Brady Service Center. Recycling items may also be taken to the City Recycling Center located at the City Landfill on Highway 87 North. Items that are accepted include: bottles, plastics, cardboard, newspapers, and magazines.

TO CONSERVE ELECTRICITY:

Turn off ceiling fans when you leave the room. Remember that fans cool people, not rooms, by creating a wind chill effect.

TO CONSERVE WATER:

Inspect irrigation systems, fix leaks and broken or clogged sprinkler heads. Watering lawns and gardens at the most opportune times conserves our precious resource. Water generally evaporates most rapidly between 10AM-4PM. Restrict watering before or after those times and you will likely use less.
