Are you Storm Ready?

Do you have CodeRed on your cell phone? If not, sign-up by going to www.bradytx.us. Click CodeRed Button located in the middle of the home page and register your information. CodeRed will give you local emergency news about weather and other events happening in Brady and McCulloch County. Have you heard the Outdoor Sirens? You have to be outside to hear them. They are tested every month, first Monday at 12 noon, step outside and listen for them. During the tornado warning in Brady last month, they were going off and announcing a pre-recorded message that said "this is not a drill, take cover immediately." The Best thing to do if a tornado is in our area is to seek shelter in an interior room, on the lowest floor of your home, school, or office. Anytime you hear the sirens, except the first Monday 12noon – it is not a drill!

When bad weather comes to our area, tune to the local TV stations, weather channel, weather radios, and local radios. Our emergency management staff are on the phones with the National Weather Service watching radars, getting the latest and most timely information that we can share with the public. Storm spotters are also dispatched and are out across the county watching for tornadoes or other damaging weather. Be alert and have a plan to take action. Be Storm Ready!

Understanding Tornado Watch and Warning Terms

Tornado Watch	Due to weather Conditions, Tornado formation is possible.
Tornado Warning	A tornado has been sighted or detected on radar.

Failure to Submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report (DLQOR)
MONITORING, ROUTINE(DBP), MAJOR/CHLORINE

The CITY OF BRADY WATER SYSTEM PWS ID1540001 has violated the monitoring/reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residuals within the distribution system, monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system, and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a quarterly basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contamination.

This violation(s) occurred in the monitoring period second quarter of 2018.

The City of Brady is taking the following actions to address this issue:

“The sampling violation noted was reported late. In the future, sampling reporting requirements will be met by ensuring no late deliveries to TCEQ.”

Please share this information with all people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Don't Clog Storm Drains

Leaves are beginning to turn all different shades of fall colors, and eventually fall. Please be mindful when blowing leaves around. Blowing them into the street gets them out of your yard, but they eventually end up somewhere. For our City, it's usually in the storm water drain where they clog pipes and result in street flooding and pose other hazards. In extreme cases, water can back up into homes. Instead of blowing leaves into the street, we recommend bagging them up or mulching them in your yard. Bagged leaves pick-up occur in January and April.
