
3. EXECUTIVE SESSION

- B. Pursuant to Section 551.087 (Economic Development), the City Council will deliberate the offer of a financial or other incentive or to discuss or deliberate regarding commercial or financial information that the City Council has received from a prospective cement plant (US Cement), retail, and other development projects that the City Council seeks to have locate in or near the City and/or with which the City Council is conducting economic development negotiations.
- C. Pursuant to Section 551.072 (Deliberations about Real Property), the City Council will deliberate the purchase, exchange lease, or value of real property as the deliberation in an open meeting will have the detrimental effect on the position of the City in negotiations with a third person.
- Pursuant to Section 551.074 (Personnel Matters) the City Council will deliberate the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline, or dismissal of a public officer or employee – City Manager.

SUMMARY:

The city added in February a monthly code enforcement division court to address in a timely manner our city code issues in an effort to hold any violators in compliance with our code of ordinances. Case attention has improved, but we need to do more.

Issues to discuss:

- 1) Hire Municipal Judge, two associates with one being a city employee. Pay rate per hour.
- 2) Currently it appears that 25% of tickets are paid; 25% go to court, and 50% ignore the ticket. Start a quarterly warrant round-up day with OT officers.
- 3) Have a Judge available 2 days a week TT 9:00am to 11:00am (4 hours per week). Hire or get a volunteer to work receptionist duties during those hours, so Jessica could dedicate that time to Court paperwork.
- 4) Keep Code Court monthly on Wednesday after 2nd Tuesday City Council Meeting and add "Show Cause Court" to maintain a follow-up time to make sure people are paying or doing what was required. City Attorney would be available, if needed.
- 5) Review Court Fines and compare to JP Court fines. Include a Dismissal Fee, Court Cost Fee, etc.
- 6) Update Community Service Program and utilize in parks and streets on a regular bases.
- 7) Develop standard orders
- 8) Analysis backlog of Court Cases and hire staff to clear-up the backlog.
- 9) Review new Municipal Court concept plan.
- 10) Other Municipal Court issues to discuss or consider.

ORDINANCE NO. 1168

AN ORDINANCE ADDING ARTICLE 7.300 ("MUNICIPAL COURT DIVISIONS") TO THE CITY OF BRADY, TEXAS CODE OF ORDINANCES; DIVIDING THE BRADY MUNICIPAL COURT INTO TWO DIVISIONS

WHEREAS, Texas Government Code 29.007 a home-rule municipality, by either charter or ordinance, to divide its municipal court into two or more panels or divisions; and

WHEREAS, Government Code 29.007(a) provides that one division shall be presided over by the presiding judge and that each additional division shall be presided over by an associate judge; and

WHEREAS, Section 4.05 of the City of Brady Home Rule Charter authorizes the City Council to review the operation of the municipal court at the discretion of the Council; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADY, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Code of Ordinances of the City of Brady, Texas, is hereby amended by adding a new section, Article 7.300 ("Municipal Court Divisions") to read in its entirety:

"ARTICLE 7.300 MUNICIPAL COURT DIVISIONS"

Sec. 7.301 Popular name

This article shall be cited as the Municipal Court Division ordinance.

Sec. 7.302 Purpose

This ordinance is adopted so that the City of Brady may promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare within the City through the enforcement of the City's ordinances and applicable state laws in Municipal Court.

Sec. 7.303 Creation of Municipal Court Divisions

The Brady Municipal Court is hereby divided into the following divisions:

- (1) General State Law Division. Cases involving any state law offenses, including but not limited to transportation code, penal code and health and safety code violations, shall be adjudicated by the General State Law Division of the Brady Municipal Court.
- (2) City Code Enforcement Division. Cases involving any City ordinance violation shall be adjudicated the City Code Enforcement Division of the Brady Municipal Court.

Sec. 7.304 Qualifications for Appointment as a Judge

As established by the City of Brady Home Rule Charter, the presiding judge and associate judges are appointed by City Council and the presiding judge shall be an eligible voter of the City of Brady. An associate judge appointed to preside over the City Code division shall be a magistrate with the same powers as the presiding judge.

Sec. 7.305 Operations of Municipal Court Divisions

- (a) Unless specifically altered by resolution of the City Council, the General State Law division of the Brady Municipal Court shall be presided over by the presiding judge and the City Code Enforcement Division shall be presided over by an associate judge.
- (b) Judges are not authorized to transfer cases, exchange benches, or preside over any division other than the one as appointed by council, unless expressly authorized by resolution of the City Council.
- (c) Judges may temporarily be reassigned divisions by the Municipal Court Clerk in cases of sickness, absence, or vacation to avoid the court date itself from being rescheduled.

<u>Section 2.</u> This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after publication as required by Section 3.16 of the City of Brady Home Rule Charter.

<u>Section 3.</u> If any section or part of this ordinance is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions of this ordinance but shall be confined in its operation to the specific section or sections that are held unconstitutional or invalid.
